Architecture Week Prague 2013

7th international festival of architecture **Architecture Week Prague 2013** is organized under the patronage of the President of CR, Miloš Zeman, in the premises of the Convent of St. George at the Prague Castle from September 23 to October 20, 2013. The main theme of this year's festival is architectural heritage and contemporary architecture, and its aim is to present Czech as well as international historical architectural heritage and to enable its comparison with contemporary and newly emerging architecture. Exhibitions shown during the festival will present architecture of almost thirty Czech, Polish, and Slovak cities, modern and historical architecture of forty countries (this exhibition is traditionally prepared in cooperation with embassies and cultural institutes of the participating countries), and the festival will also present all monuments listed as UNESCO world heritage (745 monuments from 157 countries). Another part of the festival will be lectures by Czech and foreign architects taking place in the National Technical Library, exhibition openings, a conference, days of architecture of selected countries, days of cities, architectural walks, and other events that regular visitors of the festival are used to. The festival will be interesting for architecture students who will have the opportunity to explore a wide range of architectonic styles in one place, to observe impact of each period on modern and contemporary architecture and to evaluate possible connections and fusions of architecture in different times and different cultures. Students can thus liven their studies up at the beginning of the new term.

Playful architect

There's something in store for children too: As a part of the festival there will be a new national project called Playful architect. It aims to introduce historical architecture to schoolchildren from 3rd and 4th grades, to show them what architectural heritage is and why is it important to care about it and protect it. Children had to draw or paint selected architectural monuments from their city. The best works will be shown in the Convent of St. George at the Prague Castle. Participating classes will have the opportunity to spend a day at the Prague Castle with interesting program including a guided tour to the exhibition Story of the Prague Castle, they'll get presents and above all will meet the First Lady of the CR, Ivana Zemanová, who is the patron of the whole project. The project will involve more than 600 children, 20 elementary schools from 20 cities all over the Czech Republic. We would like to set up a new tradition of annual meetings of schoolchildren at the beginning of the school year at the Prague Castle. We would also like to develop the project in the international context. Each year will have a special theme.

Expert conference

On October 3, 2013, from 2 pm, in Brožík Hall of the Old Town Hall, there will be an expert conference **Preservation of Cultural Heritage within the EU** co-organized by the Prague City Hall and Czech Heritage UNESCO. The conference will be attended by Michael Turner, representative of UNESCO, leading world experts on the preservation of monuments and architectural heritage. The conference will be opened by Oldřich Lomecký, Mayor of the City of Prague 1, Michael Turner, representative of UNESCO, Naděžda Goryczková, General Director of the National Heritage Institute of CR, and Katarína Kosová, General Director of Heritage Institute of SR and Jiří Černý, Director of Artechnic-Schréder and partner of festival. Lectures will be given by for example Antonio Natali, Director of Uffizi Gallery in Florence, who will speak about recent restoration works in the gallery and opening of new halls, further on Nikita Yavein (Studio 44), architect from the Union of Architects of Russia, with a lecture called Architecture of St. Petersburg and Reconstruction of Hermitage, Frédéric Didier, the main architect of historical monuments (Administration of the castle and the city of Versailles), Carlotta Del Bianco, cofounder of Romualdo Del Bianco Foundation. The conference will be hosted by Jakub Železný. Invitations only.

Days of Cities in Prague

Within the festival Architecture Week Prague, the project Days of Cities in Prague, at the Republic Square, will present countries and cities with their own programs, prepared especially on this occasion. Friday, September 27, will be the **Day of the City of České Budějovice**, on which the films will introduce you to the history and the presence of this city and you will have a chance to experience a virtual "ride" through the city center. Beer degustation and live music will be a part of the program. You can see performances of the street theatre and the genuine tambor drummer will invite you to a number of attractions. And since the Town Hall in České Budějovice is known also for beekeeping and producing their own honey, the visitors can see an exhibition of macrophotographs focusing on bees. The Day will be opened by the city mayor.

On Saturday, September 28, the **city of Olomouc** will be presented, the Day will be opened by the city mayor and the chief architect of the city of Olomouc, during the whole day a trio of musicians in historical costumes will play selection of baroque opera (a musical company Ensemble Damian) and films about Olomouc will be showed.

On Monday, September 30, the **Day of the city of Písek** will take place – on dibond panels in front of the marquee, the visitors will have an opportunity to see an exhibition The Story of the City of Písek, to see (and perhaps also try) gold panning, to taste baked cookies and get to know the history of the city of Písek, which will celebrate the 770th anniversary of its establishment. A medieval musical band and a dance group Gracia will give their performances. The character of Hašek's good soldier Švejk will remind us of the World War I anniversary. The velocipedists will attract you to cycleways in Písek and a rich program will be completed with puppet theatre. The Day of the city of Písek will be opened by the city mayor.

Tuesday, October 1, will be dedicated to the **city of Přerov** – beer tasting and bakery specialties, live music (an ensemble Hanácký soubor) and showing films about the history and the presence of the city of Přerov. The Day will be opened by the city mayor.

Day of the Slovak City of Skalica will be held on Wednesday, October 10, 2013. The visitors to this Day can enjoy dulcimer music, showing presentation films about history and interesting sites in the city, and degustation of traditional rolled pastry called "trdelník" and wine. The Day will be opened by the city mayor.

On Thursday, October 3, the **City of Tábor** will be presented, especially by its historical musical production, and also by presentation of true Hussite battle wagon (including the period staff), performances of swordsmen, jugglers and clowns, being so popular especially with children. The Day, when the Hussite history of Tábor will come alive, will be opened by the city mayor.

The City of Žilina will have its presentation at the Republic Square on Thursday, October 4, 2013, with degustations of local specialties, the visitors can get to know the history and folklore of the region of Malá Fatra, which is one of the most attractive tourist destinations, and commemorate the 300th anniversary of execution of Juraj Jánošík. The Day of the City of Žilina will be opened by the city mayor.

Saturday, October 5, will focus on **Polish culture** - in cooperation with the Polish Institute in Prague it will present Polish cities included in the UNESCO World Heritage List, there will also be live music. The Day of Polish culture will be opened by the ambassador of Poland and the director of the Polish Institute. **Day of the City of Pardubice** will take place on Tuesday, Oct 8, 2013. The city will present its major attributes – horses and gingerbread. The visitors can taste regional products (for example Pernštejn beer), there will be a workshop of gingerbread decoration and a local band performance. The city will also mention Velká Pardubická steeplechase that will be held at the Pardubice race-course the following week. **The Day of the City of Znojmo** will be held on Wednesday, October 9 - the visitors will have an opportunity to taste wines and food, to enjoy folk music, presentations of films about the history and the presence of the city and to see an exhibition of photographs. Various competitions are prepared, too. The Day will be opened by the mayor of the city of Znojmo.

Thursday, October 10, will be the **Day of Slovak Culture and Tourism**, which is organized in cooperation with the SACR (Slovak Tourist Board). Slovak cities included in the UNESCO World Heritage List, but also other important tourist destinations in Slovakia will be presented here. The presentations will be accompanied by live music and performances of a dance group. The Day of Slovak Culture will be opened by the ambassador of Slovakia.

Festival publications

The publication issued together with this year's festival Architecture Week Prague 2013 will be bilingual (Czech-English) and will have two parts. The first one will be dedicated to monuments and historical architecture, those listed as UNESCO World Heritage and other outstanding objects in the Czech Republic as well as abroad. The second part of the publication will be dedicated to contemporary cultural architecture (museums, exhibition halls, galleries, concert halls, art schools, or libraries) from all over the world. The readers will thus have the opportunity to compare the values of historical architectural heritage with the quality of newly emerging architecture that might in the future also become a heritage of its own time. Besides that, the publication will be dedicated to heritage protection and preservation within the EU.

Exhibitions in the Convent of St. George, Prague Castle:

1. Exhibition of the UNESCO World Architectural Heritage

The aim of this exhibition will be presentation of less known objects being part of the list. 745 monuments from 157countries. In cooperation with WHC UNESCO.

2. Exhibition focused on Czech architectural heritage listed in UNESCO

Comparison of Czech monuments listed as UNESCO World Heritage with selected realizations in the contemporary Czech architecture.

3. Exhibition Style is not for writing, style is for looking

Czech Heritage UNESCO shows typical features of architectonic styles on the examples of Czech and Moravian monuments. Roman style is represented by entrance portal of basilica in Třebíč, tower of the Church of the Holy Spirit in Telč, or St. Martin`s Rotunda at Vyšehrad, Prague. Gothic style is represented by St. Barbara Cathedral in Kutná Hora, or Vladislav Hall at the Prague Castle. Renaissance style can be found at the castles in Telč, Litomyšl, or Český Krumlov. Baroque era is shown on the examples of the Zelená hora in Žďár nad Sázavou, synagogue in Třebíč, the Holy Trinity Column in Olomouc, or Kroměříž castle. 19th century styles are presented at the castle in Lednice, the National Theatre in Prague, or the village square in Holašovice.

4. Movies about Slovak UNESCO heritage

Movies lent by the Heritage Institute of SR about Vlkolínec, Banská Štiavnica, Levoča, Spiš, and Spiš Castle.

5. Exhibition Arch Heritage

Exhibition presenting outstanding historical, modern, and contemporary buildings both in the CR and abroad, not listed as UNESCO heritage yet important and architecturally valuable (e.g. sacral architecture, museums, galleries, exhibition halls, theatres, concert halls, etc.).

6. Exhibition Arch World 2013

Annual international display of contemporary architecture from all over the world organized in cooperation with embassies and institutes of the participating countries. This year, the exhibition will present cultural objects (museums, galleries, theatres, exhibition halls, etc.).

7. Exhibition Prague Castle From History To Presence

Exhibition showing architectural history of the Prague Castle – original plans, conversions, modifications up to the contemporary shape of the object. Prepared by the Prague Castle Administration.

8. Italian architecture: Exhibition Common Pavilions

The Diener & Diener Company decided to explore the environment between architecture and its perception, it invited a photograph Gabriel Basilico and several authors to speak about thirty national pavilions in Giardini in Venice.

Exhibition of photographs of 29 original national pavilions built in Giardini, Venice, by 33 architects from all over the world. The exhibition creates a platform for discussion about architectonic forms. Unlike usual presentation of architects, this discussion is formed by invited authors, critics and experts.

Traditional literary essays are accompanied by photographic essay by Gabriel Basilico. World famous for his photographic works on the physiognomy of architecture and urban landscape, Basilico was commissioned by the heritage department of La Biennale to document interiors and exteriors of all national pavilions. In cooperation with the Embassy of Italy and Italian-Czech Business Chamber, supported by Eleutheria Foundation.

9. Brazilian architecture: Contemporary Brazilian Architecture

The exhibition will present contemporary Brazilian architecture – Indio da Costa, prepared by Vera Hampl. In cooperation with the Embassy of Brazil.

10. Danish architecture: Exhibition Modern Danish Architecture

20 photographs of modern Danish architecture by famous Danish photographer Andreas Trier Mørch. In cooperation with the Embassy of Denmark.

11. Exhibition Architecture of Prague 6

A. Baba Colony

Construction of Baba Colony was a remarkable architectonic-constructional project of the 1930's. Union of Czechoslovak Works (founded in 1914) tried to create a national expression, style after the WW II. Within this endeavor, they presented the public a new face of architecture – Baba Colony – modern housing in functionalist style. The Union acquired a plot at the edge of Prague, in the location called Baba. The houses were tailored to fit particular owners. An ideal teamwork of constructor and architect was the precondition of success. In the end, 30 houses – villas - were built arranged in a compact terrain configuration. The exhibition will show a unique collection of 33 models and documentation. A movie The Construction of Baba Colony will be shown, containing authentic shots and unique atmosphere of the 1931.

B. Significant buildings of Prague 6

The exhibition will present other significant buildings in Prague 6, such as Villa Müller by Adolf Loos, Villa Bílek by sculptor František Bílek, Villa Pélle by Rudolf Koukola, and other interesting houses.

Both exhibitions are organized in cooperation with the District of Prague 6, under the patronage of Marie Kousalíková, Mayor of the Prague 6.

12. Exhibition Playful Architect

Exhibition of the best works.
